It is naturally easier to look at all the serious environmental issues Iowans are facing but we must remember that the nature we have today is here because

someone out there cared before us. If we didn't have those people, we wouldn't be seeing an increase in the monarch population in this year's preliminary numbers. We wouldn't have public land for people to enjoy and for the wildlife to thrive. There are people who care, that is my hope. Nature is our original classroom. Being outdoors, for whatever reason, taught us patience, imagination, resilience, purpose and creativity. It taught us numbers, colors, smells and textures. We first learned from our natural environment and for that we need to continue to advocate for our first classroom. We cannot count on anyone to do it for us. It only makes sense to be passionate about what you care about. I see it in teachers, health care workers, small business owners...they constantly stand up for the people, their people. I find myself doing this for nature, for our state, our water, our animals, the land we use, and the land we take from. Just like the other 100 people I was surrounded by at the Nature Summit, I am not alone in this fight, but I do know we have to keep on keeping on.


Thank You


